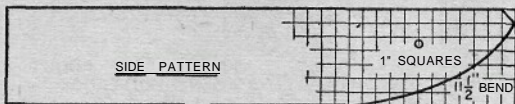
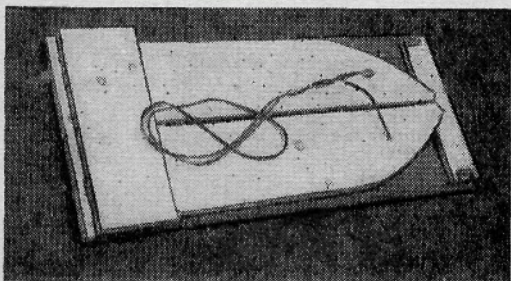
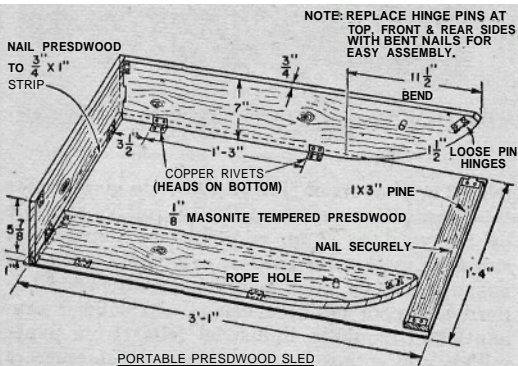


Folding Sled

THIS portable sled rides flat in your automobile trunk and can be quickly opened and loaded for hauling supplies in or out of the woods on winter fishing or hunting trips. Other uses include hauling groceries and airing the youngsters.

Designed by Roman Luger, North St. Paul, the sled is simple to construct. The sides and end are 1 in. lumber and the bottom is .125" tem-



pered Masonite bent up at the front whenever the sled is assembled. Fasten the tempered Presdwood to the hinges with .125" copper rivets. Loose pin hinges, with bent nails substituting for the pins to simplify removal, hold the sides, back and front together when assembled. Attach the bottom piece of Presdwood to a 1 x 3 in. piece of pine at the front and a $\frac{3}{4}$ x 1 in. wood strip at the end that forms the back of the sled.
